## **Education and Training Program Services:**

In compliance with the Federal Mine Safety and Health Act (MSHA) of 1977, Title 30 CFR, Part 46, 47, 48, 49, 56, 57, 58 and 62, new miners' representatives, contractors, and others exposed to mine hazards at a mine sites are required to have various levels of training with the emphasis placed on miner's rights and current health and safety regulations. ## Our office continues to receive calls about the **Opening and Closing Notifications**:

CFR. 56/57.1000 requires operator's notification to MSHA for Commencement of operations (intermittent or continuous) or Closure (temporary or permanent) of any changes at a mine's site. In order to comply with this standard, mine operators may choose to make their notification to MSHA by one of the following five options.
